#### English Vocabulary

### NOUN /noun/

- A word (other than a pronoun) used to identify any of a class of people, places, or things.
- Also known as a "proper noun"

#### VERB /verb/

 A word that expresses an action ( to run), occurrence ( to happen), or state of being ( to appear).

#### PRONOUN /pro-noun/

- A word that is used instead of a noun or noun phrase
- Pronouns sometimes refer to either a noun that has already been mentioned
- Some examples are: mine, yours

## ADJECTIVE /ad-jek-tiv/

 A word you use to <u>describe</u> a person, place, or thing

#### ADVERB /ad-verb/

- A word that describes a verb (he sings <u>loudly</u>)
- A word that describes an adjective (<u>very</u> tall)
- A word that describes another adverb (<u>ended</u> <u>too</u> <u>quickly</u>)

# TRANSITION WORD /tran-zi-SHun/

 A word that helps connect or link ideas, phrases, sentences, or paragraphs
