What is a Genre? /zhan-ra/

As humans we have a tendency to group things together.

Genre = a category or grouping of creative work - often organized by finding similarities in structure, style, or topic.

When it comes to writing, there are 5 MAIN GENRES.

Subgenre = a category or grouping of creative work - often organized by finding similarities in structure, style, or topic that is also grouped into ONE OF THE 5 MAIN GENRES

There are 15 SUBGENRES.

FICTION = Fake stories with made up events and characters

There are 4 Subgenres in Fiction writing:

• FANTASY:

 Contains magical and/or supernatural elements that do not exist in the real world (think dragons, werewolves, magic, wizards, unicorns, made-up creatures)

• SCIENCE FICTION:

Contains scientific elements and futuristic technology (think robots, space, aliens, the future)

• HISTORICAL FICTION:

 Contains real historic events of the past but is a fake story with made-up or fake characters

• **REALISTIC FICTION:**

 Contains made-up or fake characters and fake events, but the setting resembles our real world and real societies

DRAMA

Drama = A story that is presented through dialogue or many speaking roles

There are 2 Subgenres in Drama writing:

- COMEDY
 - Has a happy ending
 - Has humour
- TRAGEDY
 - Has a sad or upsetting ending
 - Is very serious and dramatic

NONFICTION!

NONFICTION = *Writing that addresses real people, real events,, and real objects* There are 4 Subgenres in Nonfiction writing:

• INFORMATIONAL WRITING

- Gives the reader information about a real idea, place, person, or thing
- PERSUASIVE WRITING
 - Tries to convince the reader to change their opinion about a real idea, place, person, or thing
- AUTOBIOGRAPHY
 - The author writes a real account of their own true life story
- **BIOGRAPHY**
 - The author writes a real account of another person's true life story



FOLKLORE = *Fictional, culturally based stories passed on from generation to generation* There are 5 Subgenres in Folklore writing:

• FAIRYTALE

A fictional story passed on from the previous generation that usually contains magical creatures,
fairies, witches. Usually made for children's entertainment.

• FABLE

 A story passed on from the previous generation. Usually very short and contains a life lesson for children.

• TALL TALE

• A fictional story passed on from the previous generation that contains unbelievable elements, but pretends to be real (the story is made up of lies).

• MYTH

 A fictional story passed on from the previous generation, and contains elements of the generation's beliefs and values.

• LEGEND

A fictional story passed on from the previous generation where there are human characters. The generation usually believes that the human characters and events in the story actually occured in history.
