- Check lists

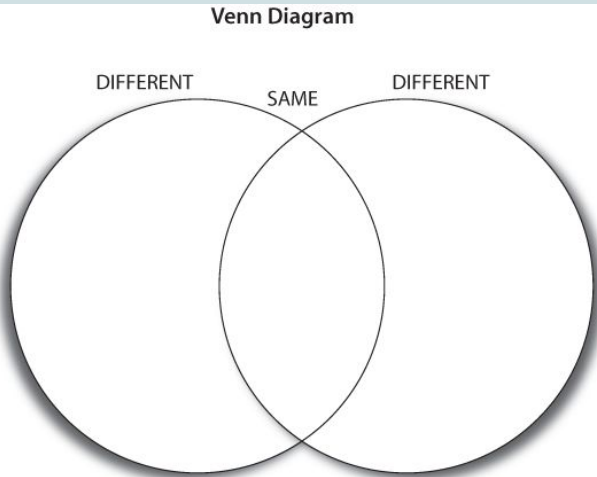


Infographics allow us to tell a more complete story of the data or information.

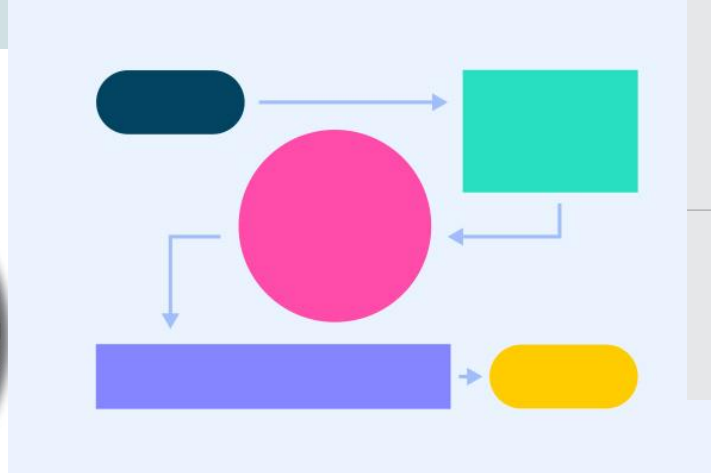
They are more engaging than most ways of communicating data and information.

Here are some examples you may find on an infographic:

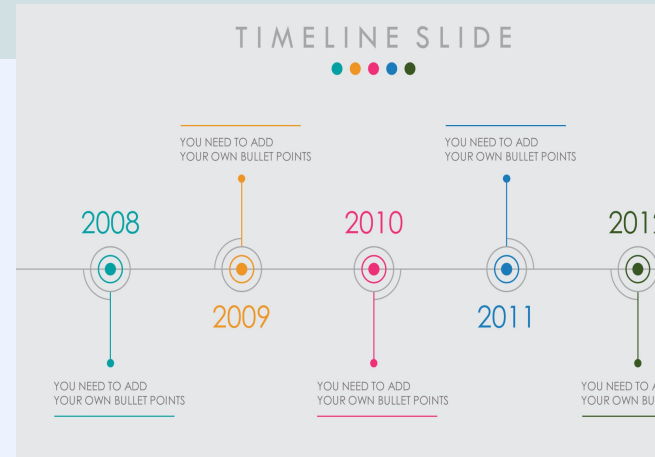
Venn Diagram

Test Yourself

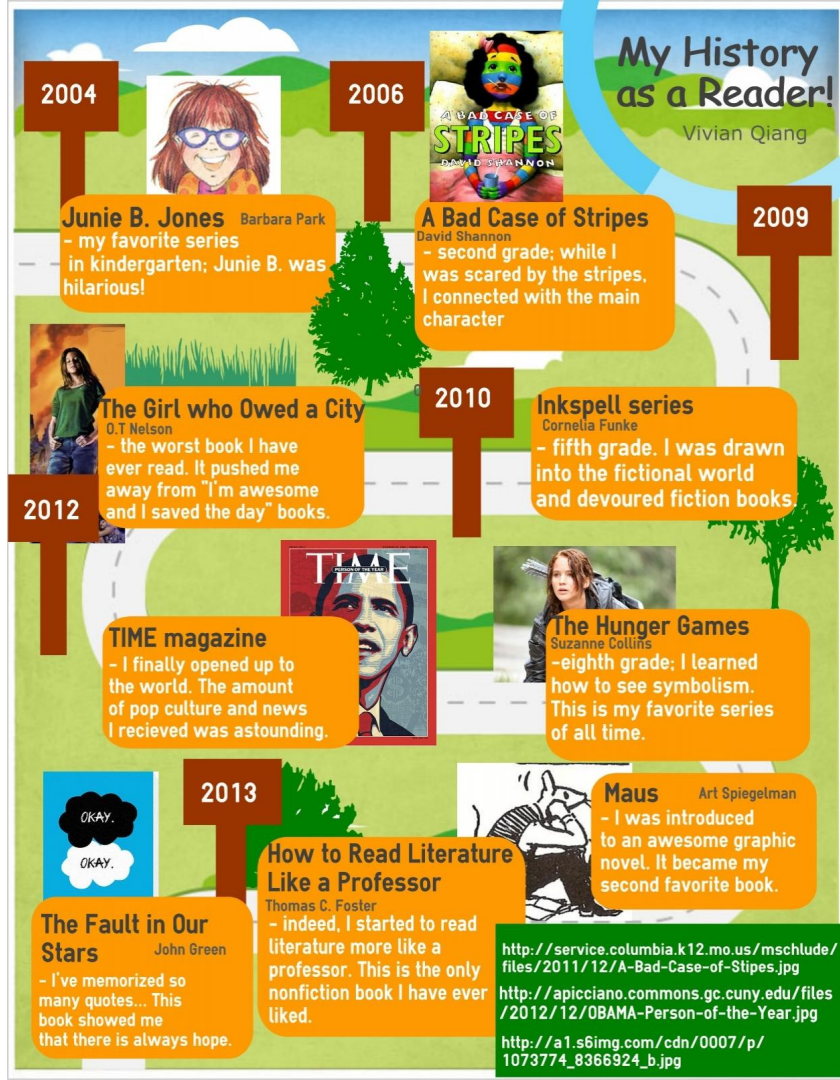
