In Canada, the difference between college and university will typically come down to the credentials that you earn.

In college, you will typically earn a one or two year diploma or certificate while in university you'll typically earn a three or four year bachelor's degree.

How to choose an ideal Canadian university/college?

Think about the university/ college:

- ▶ Look into overall rankings, considering factors like academic reputation, faculty quality, international student ratio, and rankings specific to your desired course. Also, seek out any exceptional accreditations and accolades the university has earned in terms of the program you are interested in.

Think about yourself and other factors:

- ▶ What is your GPA? Is it good enough to apply for your dream university/ program?
- ▶ The place you will be staying in – academic atmosphere, peer motivation; is the city an ideal city for a young person to develop and thrive?
- ▶ Your average monthly expenditure.
- ▶ The climate of the city you will be residing at.
