Unit 3 - Cross-cultural communication (21 Hours)

Unit Description:

This unit introduces students how to communicate effectively in a multicultural environment. Students are expected to learn how to understand a whole range of differences between Chinese and western cultures. Specifically, this unit consists of the following topics:

Different ways of thinking Religions & Customs Festivals Education **Family** Multiculturalism in Canada APA citation

By the end of the unit, students will be able to

- better understand Chinese culture and various differences between Chinese culture and western cultures; they also learn how to navigate with ease in cross-cultural communication; they get to know the Multiculturalism policy in Canada; they learn how to cite in APA style efficiently to get prepared for their college life.
- demonstrate an understanding of information in the target language about aspects of culture in diverse communities where the target language is spoken and other communities around the world, and of sociolinguistic conventions in the target language used in a variety of situations and communities.
- communicate information and ideas effectively, using a range of strategies, appropriate language structures, and level-appropriate language suited to the purpose and audience:
- identify the purpose(s), characteristics, and aspects of style of a variety of adapted and authentic text forms; determine meaning in a variety of texts in the target language, using a range of reading comprehension strategies;
- write texts in the target language for different purposes and audiences, using a variety of forms and knowledge of language structures and conventions of the written language



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appropriate for this course; use the stages of the writing process – including pre-writing, producing drafts, revising, editing, and publishing – to develop and organize content, clarify ideas and expression, correct errors, and present their written work in the target language effectively; in their written work in the target language, demonstrate an awareness of aspects of culture in diverse communities where the target language is spoken and other communities around the world, and of the appropriate use of sociolinguistic conventions in the target language in a variety of situations.

- better understand Chinese culture and various differences between Chinese culture and western cultures, such as in ways of thinking, religions & customs, festivals, education and family, etc.
- learn how to navigate with ease in cross-cultural communication;
