EYE CONTACT



- **Look at your audience when speaking to them**
 - **Connect with them**
 - **Make them feel important**
 - **Make yourself Trustworthy**
 - **Look away every few seconds so that you don't seem too intense**
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BODY LANGUAGE

- **Use your body to communicate with your audience**
- **How you stand or sit**
- **Folded or relaxed hands**
- **Position of your head**
- **Gesticulation- Arm and hand movement**



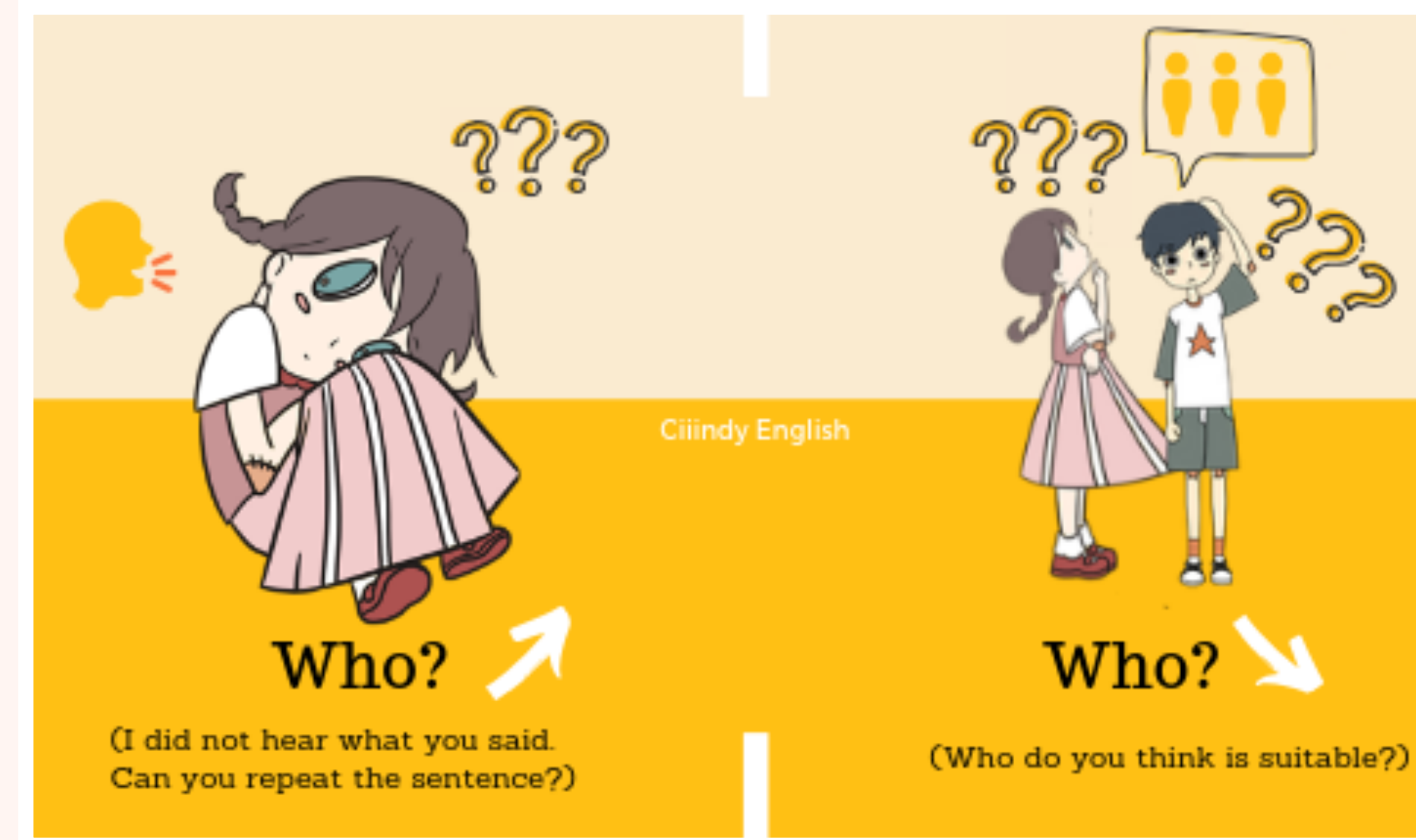
VOCAL INTONATION

Used for questions, statements and emphasis

Expresses emotion
