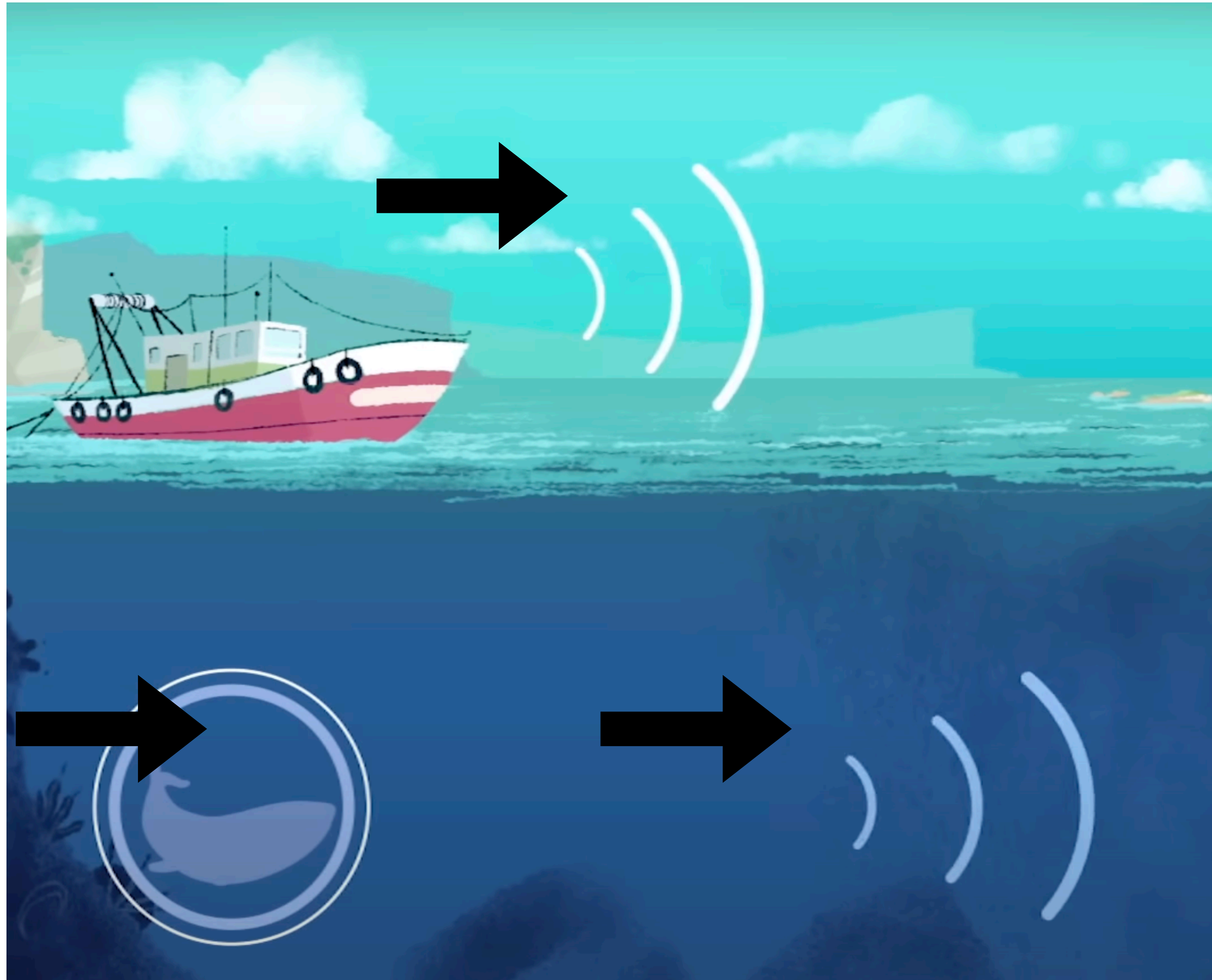

- Sometimes the text provides visuals for us - as in the case of many videos and textbooks. These visuals make it easier for us to connect with what we are reading.

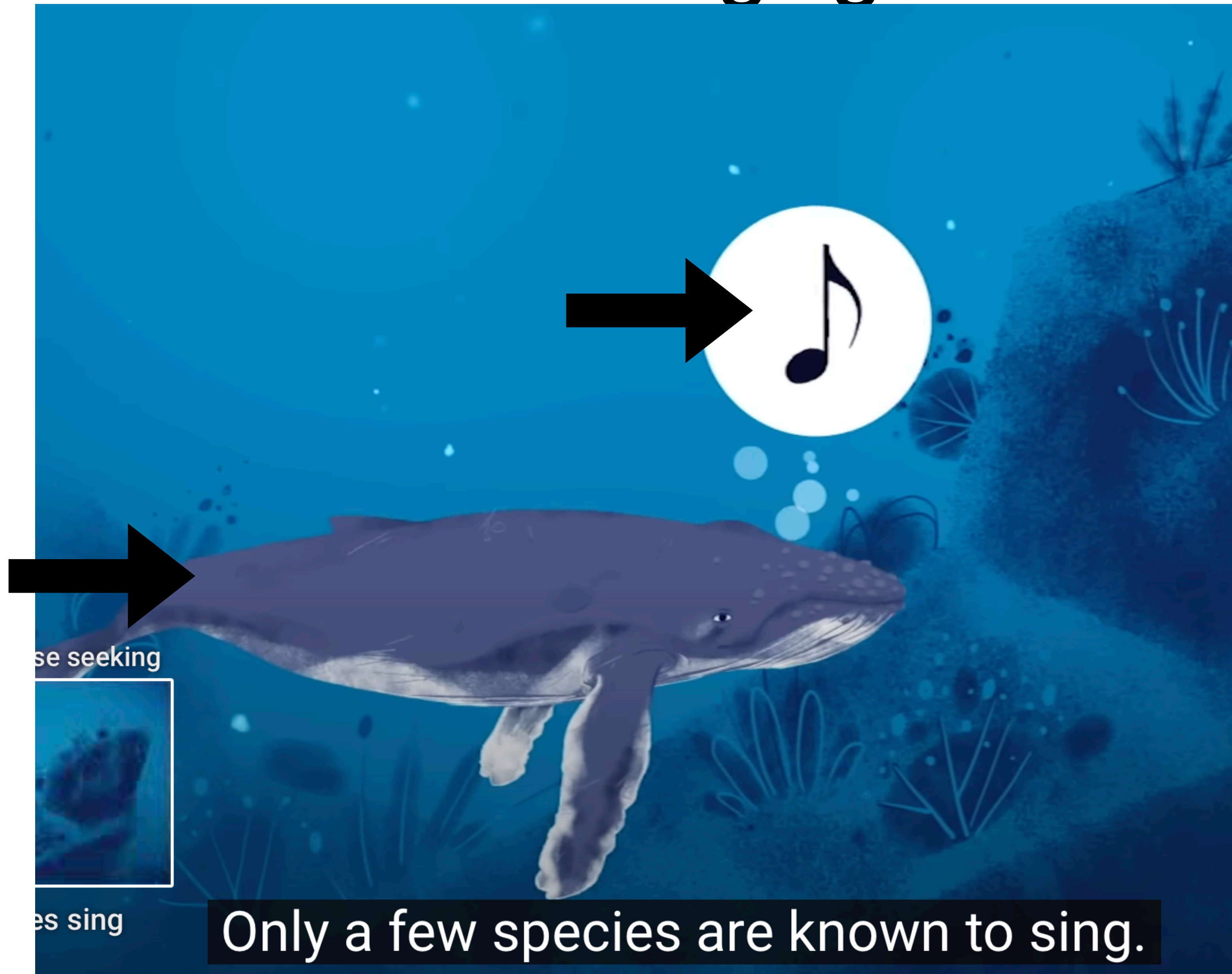
