

#### WHAT IS AN ADJECTIVE?

- Adjectives are words the describe nouns
- Adjectives answer questions such as: What kind? Which one? How many?

#### Adjectives can be used to Describe:

- Colour: ex.blue, red, green, brown, purple
- Size: ex.big, small, tall, short
- Temperature: ex.Cold,warm,hot,cool
- Opinion: ex. Good, pretty, right, wrong, funny

# QUALITATIVE/DESCRIPTIVE ADJECTIVES:



- To describe the quality of a person or thing
- For example: tall, excellent, slim, young, square, plastic
- The tall girl is my classmate
- The students achieved excellent test results

# QUANTITATIVE ADJECTIVES:

- To indicate the number or amount of things
- For example: some, much, little, all, enough, several
- She found many pens under the table.
- There was no milk in the jug.
- There are twenty three students in this class



# DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES:

- To point out nouns
- For example: this, these, that, those
- This is my friend, David.
- Those books belong to her



#### INTERROGATIVE ADJECTIVES:




- Used with a noun to ask questions
- For example:who,what,where, when,

why, how, whose

- Whose pen is this?
- Which way shall we go?

## POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES:



- Used to show possession
- For example: my, your, his, her, our, their, its
- This is her hat.
- Their parents came to my house yesterday

#### DISTRIBUTIVE ADJECTIVES:

- To show that the person or things are counted collectively. Refers to members of a group as individuals.
- For example: each, every, either, neither
- Each participant was asked to complete a survey.
- Either of these movies would be interesting to me

## COMPOUND ADJECTIVES:

- Made up of two or more words, often linked together with hyphens to show it is one adjective.
- For example: light-weight,duty- free, four-foot, part-time
- We have to be open-minded about things.
- The lady is wearing a pair of high- heeled shoes.
