What is an interview?

- A structured conversation where one participant asks questions, and the other provides answers
- The person asking the questions has the questions prepared beforehand
- The person answering the questions might have practised answering questions beforehand

Where might you see an interview?

Interviews can take place anywhere. Here are some examples where you might see an interview:

- News Channels and reporters
- TV Talk Shows with celebrities and political figures
- On a date with a potential partner
- On a job site with an employer
- On school grounds for admissions into a university or private school

Verbal Communication

Verbal communication is the action of speaking aloud and using one's verbal skills to share information with another person.

Non-verbal Communication

Communication of messages or signals through a nonverbal way such as eye contact,

facial expressions, gestures, posture, and the distance between two people.

- Gestures: eye-contact, head nodding, hand movement
- Facial Expressions: mouth movements, eye/eyebrow movements
- Space: personal space, handshake, etc.
- *Posture*: open or closed, body position
