

CONFLICT GANG VIOLENCE. (EXTERNAL)

The young protagonist, Andy has been stabbed by a rival gang member. **"He had heard the voice saying, 'That's for you Royal! "** (page 1) He is left fighting for his life on the dirty street corner. No one wants to help him because he is a gang member.

CONFLICT #2- INTERNAL STRUGGLES

Andy no longer wants to be a royal. He realized that being in a gang has cost him his life. He wants people to see him as Andy, not a gang member. "If he died, he was Andy. He was not a Royal. He was simply Andy" (page 8)

THE IMPORTANCE OF IDENTITY


- Andy loses his identity, once he joins the Royals.


