What is D Day?

June 6, 1944
Normandy Invasion

Dunkirk evacuation
started at May 26 1940
Ended at June 4 1940
198,000 British and 140,000
French and Belgian troops had
been saved.



The Allied invasion of western Europe

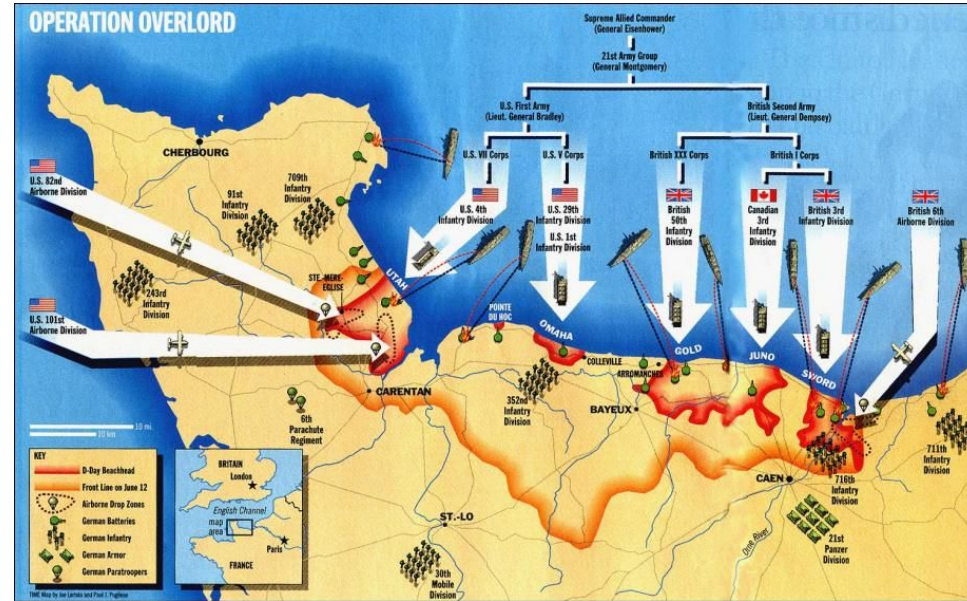
Army:

The British army: 54,000 infantry troops and had 1,030 casualties.

The Canadian army: 21,400 infantry troops and had 1,200 casualties.

The United States Army: 54,000 infantry troops and had 2,700 casualties.

By the end of June approximately 858,000 troops and 150,000 vehicles had landed.
