Zentangle Portrait Project



Materials

- Photocopy of yourself (black and white). The photo should fill most of the page
- Drawing paper
- Watercolor Paper
- Fine Sharpie markers (black)
- Eraser, ruler, Circle template (if you have one)
- Patterns reference sheets (research several patterns online)
- Watercolor Paints
- Brushes
- Palette
- Water Containers
- Paper Towels or Tissues
- Masking Tape

Steps

1. SNAP SELFIE
 - Take some selfie pictures or use a photo you already have. You can be creative and have fun with this. Try on some big sunglasses or a hat. Exaggerate your personality or just be silly.
 - Once you have a photo you like, print it out in Black and White.
2. GRAPHITE TRANSFER:
 - Now, you are going to need to do a graphite transfer to get the outline of your facial features on your watercolor paper.
3. START ON THE DESIGN
 - There are many ways to begin! Start by drawing lines over the face outline you transferred onto your watercolor paper. Try to follow the natural curves of the face to enhance its features.
 - The goal is to divide the page into unique and interesting shapes. These could look like shattered glass or flow more naturally—be creative!
4. It's time to add color to your Zentangle!
 - After filling all the sections with patterns, start painting them with watercolor.
 - Focus on creating harmony by using analogous colors. Use your creativity to add emphasis or create contrast where desired. Feel free to experiment and enjoy the process of bringing your artwork to life

- Understand the principles of Zentangle art and how to create intricate patterns using mindfulness techniques.
- Apply specific Zentangle patterns and techniques to create a structured, creative design.
