

Assignment 2: PPT Presentation

You've learned about how universal PowerPoints are in the workplace. For this presentation, you will practice making effective PPT presentations.

The topic will be a self-introduction. Your presentation can talk about things such as

1. Basic information about yourself (e.g., hometown, age, favorite food, favorite book/movie/song, etc.)
2. Some information about your family
3. Your future goals and aspirations
4. Your role models
5. The most memorable experience in your life
6. What would you do if you had a million dollars?
7. What would you wish for if you found a genie?

Time limit: 3-4 minutes. You do NOT need to do all 7 topics. You can pick however many topics you want. Just make sure your presentation is 3-4 minutes.

Part 2: Thinking

Submit an audience analysis.

E	Expectations	Is there anything the audience expects from my presentation?	
N	Needs	Are there any special needs from the audience?	
C	Customization	How can I customize my presentation to suit my audience?	
E	Environment	What kind of environment will I be giving the presentation in? (audience size, technology, etc.)
