

## Hadfield Is Out of This World



Astronaut Colonel Chris Hadfield is known for a lot of firsts: the first Canadian space shuttle mission specialist; the first Canadian to operate the Canadarm in orbit; the first and only Canadian to ever board the Russian space station, *Mir*; the first Canadian to leave a spacecraft and float freely in space, but becoming the first Canadian commander of the *International Space Station* (or ISS) on March 13, 2013, might be the most memorable of all.

Chris was born in Sarnia, Ontario and raised

in Milton. When Chris was only nine years old, he watched Neil Armstrong walk on the moon. He attributes this as the spark that ignited his interest in space travel.

With an educational background in mechanical engineering, Chris became a fighter pilot and then a test pilot. He was chosen to become one of four new Canadian astronauts from a pool of 5,330 applicants in 1992.

Although Chris was in space in 1995 and 2001, his final mission was Expedition 34/35 to the ISS, and it began when he was launched aboard the Russian spacecraft, *Soyuz*, on December 19, 2012.

On March 13, 2013, Hadfield became commander of the space station. He was described by *Forbes Magazine* as "perhaps the most social media savvy astronaut to leave earth." With the help of his son, Evan, he obtained over one million Twitter followers.

Besides performing his usual duties on board the *International Space Station* such as conducting experiments, exercising and commanding the station, Chris took thousands of breathtaking photos, created videos explaining how things are done differently in space, answered questions from the media and students via video link, and recorded music.

Hadfield sang "Is Somebody Singing" in space, a song created in collaboration with the band The Barenaked Ladies. He sang with singers across Canada for the national "Music Monday" program. Hadfield also released a music video recorded on the *International Space Station* of a modified version of the song "Space Oddity" by David Bowie. The video received over 22 million views on YouTube.

Many believe that Colonel Hadfield's popularity and excellent use of social media has brought heightened attention to space exploration. He took fantastic pictures, made space accessible, and "brought us along with him." Chris Hadfield is certainly one Canadian who is out of this world.
