Assignment # 2 : Oral Presentation "A Week in My Life: Capturing Moments"

Objective:

The goal of this assignment is to encourage you to reflect on and document your daily lives through visual storytelling. By taking a picture or a short video each day, you will create a presentation that explores the different aspects of your lives, while reflecting on the factors that make you who you are.



Instructions:

Daily Documentation:

- Each day, during the March break, you will take a photograph or a
 5-second video that shows some aspect of your life.
- Take images of yourself in different places, with different people, doing different things. (with family, and friends, doing hobbies or chores, taking trips, making personal reflections etc). Take as many images as you want, but you may only use one for each day. (seven days in total)

Reflections:

- At the end of the week, look at your pictures or videos and think about what aspect of your identity or your life they reveal. Ask yourself why you chose to capture those particular moments.
- Write a brief description for each day, describing the image and what it means to you.
- **ESLCO** students should write 2-3 sentences.
- **ESLEO** students should write 4-5 sentences.

Presentation

- Put your images or videos into a PowerPoint (PPT) presentation or a video.
- Put one image on each slide. Include your written reflection.
- Make sure that your video or PPT is well organized. It should have a title screen or page (including your name and a title)
- Include any additional elements (such as captions or background music) that enhance your presentation.

Oral Presentation:

- Students will present their ppt or video to the class.
- Each presentation should last approximately 5-7 minutes.

Success Criteria: How you will be marked

- Creativity and Originality: How uniquely and creatively did the student capture and present their daily life?
- **Reflections:** Are the reflections insightful and do they effectively convey the significance of each visual?
- **Presentation Skills**: How well did the student articulate their thoughts during the oral presentation?
- **Visual Appeal:** Is the presentation visually engaging, organized, and well-designed?
