HSB4U: Culminating Activity: Round Table Discussions



For your culminating activity in HSB4U, you will facilitate a round table on a contemporary social issue of your choice related to human development. The issue must be complex and controversial enough to warrant debate/discussion. A round table is a form of academic discussion. Participants agree on a specific topic to discuss and debate. Each person is given equal right to participate, as illustrated by the idea of a circular layout referred to in the term round table. The round table discussion is worth **30% of your final grade**. Some sample topics include: animal rights, ethics, gene manipulation, the housing crisis, etc.

Components:



1. Audio/Visual Backgrounder and Agenda:

You will provide a brief presentation (15-20 minutes) to inform the class about your issue, attempting to deliver an unbiased political, economic, and social **backgrounder** or overview of the issue. You need to provide a solid theoretical background about the issue with multiple facts and figures to support your argument. This should include a lot of detail in general.

Your presentation will conclude with an **agenda** of the **topics and corresponding questions** that you would like to focus on and address during the course of the round table discussion.

Your presentation can take any of the following formats: **Google Slides**; **PowerPoint**; **Prezi**; **Sway**

2. Supporting Materials:

*NOTE: Supporting materials MUST be provided to the teacher the day before (at the beginning of class) the scheduled round table in order for the teacher to photocopy the necessary materials so the class can prepare. You are responsible for getting the debate going with arguments.



- a. Handout:
 - i) brief backgrounder/overview of your chosen issue
 - ii) at least one (1) article for the class to read prior to the round table due the day before



iii) at least 3 questions / discussion starters to focus the round table discussion; no more than 6 questions

b. Annotated Bibliography (Four academic sources, APA Format)

This course emphasizes the ability to communicate ideas succinctly and effectively and, while personal opinions are meaningful, it is necessary to ground such ideas in research. The use of research will allow you to rethink and critically assess your own ideas and perspectives. This involves compiling a list of references of appropriate research sources and creating an annotated bibliography to provide to the class as an appendix to your handout. The entire presentation and discussion should take **45-60 minutes.**

Please note: discussions will not be postponed due to absence; students will be assessed on the facilitation of their own round table issue as well as **participation** in their classmates' round table discussions, therefore, attendance and punctuality is imperative.
